To assist the museum in one of its key strategic aims, which is to work with artists and to understand their intellectual formation and creative process, Tate has been awarded a major research grant by the Leverhulme Trust to fund a project to be directed by Professor Nigel Llewellyn (Head of Research, Tate) entitled 'Art School educated: Curriculum Change in UK Art Schools 1960-2010'.

Tate is now seeking to appoint two post-doctoral research assistants to join the project research team and to engage in original scholarly activity in the field of study. The two research assistants will undertake historical and archival enquiries in London, especially at the London art schools that will be the immediate focus of the project, and where necessary across the UK. They will be responsible for a range of activities and research outputs. This will include the creation of databases and archives of original research material, making contributions to an authoritative dedicated website on Tate Online, advising and assisting on gallery displays, researching and writing scholarly publications including monographs, articles and book chapters, supporting symposia and conferences and by facilitating the acquisition of relevant materials to the Tate Archive of British Art.
